UN Human Rights Chief urges forces in Al-Raqqa to protect civilians

High Commissioner for Human Rights Zeid Ra'ad Al Hussein on 28 June voiced grave concern for the fate of civilians caught up in the anti-ISIL/Da'esh offensive in Al-Raqqa, where up to 100,000 civilians remain trapped as the offensive intensifies. According to the Human Rights Office, at least 173 civilians have been killed by air and ground strikes since 1 June – although the real death toll may be much higher. "The intense bombardment of Al-Raqqa over the past three weeks has reportedly left civilians terrified and confused about where they can seek refuge as they are caught between ISIL's monstrosities and the fierce battle to defeat it," High Commissioner Zeid said. "Civilians must not be sacrificed for the sake of rapid military victories," he stressed. The High Commissioner called on all forces battling ISIL in Al-Raqqa, including international forces, to review their operations to ensure full compliance with international law, including taking all feasible precautions to avoid loss of civilian lives.

"We are at a time of testing of political will for real de-escalation"-Special Envoy warns

Briefing the Security Council on 27 June, Special Envoy for Syria Staffan de Mistura said that serious efforts were underway to deliver further implementation agreements regarding the de-escalation zones before an Astana meeting on 4-5 July. The Envoy said that since the signing in May of the de-escalation agreement in Astana many towns had returned to some degree of normalcy. However, in some areas, fighting has continued and even intensified. "We are at a time of testing whether the political will exists for real de-escalation and more meaningful political talks and move beyond preparatory talks", he also told the Council. On the preparations for the next round of intra-Syrian talks in Geneva from 10 to 14 July, the Envoy said that he encouraged the invitees to prepare actively and looked forward to discuss issues across four "baskets" – governance issues, constitutional issues, electoral issues, counter-terrorism, security governance and medium term confidence-building issues. Mr. de Mistura said he was considering to convene a further round towards late August or early September, before the UN General Assembly meeting.

WHO delivers medical treatments to two displaced people camps in Al-Raqqa governorate

The World Health Organization (WHO) on 22 June responded to an acute shortage of life saving medicines by dispatching a shipment of more than 12,000 treatments to the two main camps for internally displaced persons in rural Al-Raqqa. This shipment will support treatment of patients who lack adequate access to medical care. "We are eager and committed to deliver regular health assistance to people in all locations and presently for the civilians in the eastern and north eastern areas in Syria where the needs are pressing," said Ms Elizabeth Hoff, WHO representative in Syria. Al Karameh camp in rural Al-Raqqa governorate hosts more than 35,000 children, women and men while Ain-Issa camp hosts more than 3,500 people.

UNHCR welcomes admission of Syrians by Morocco

The UN Refugee Agency (UNHCR) welcomed on 22 June Morocco's decision to admit a group of Syrian refugees stranded in difficult circumstances at the country's border with Algeria since 17 April. The remaining 28 refugees from an original group of 41, including women and children, were collected on 20 June by the Moroccan police from the border and transported by bus to Bouarfa, from where they were transferred to Rabat. UNHCR is working with the authorities of Morocco and other countries to find a durable solution to the plight of these vulnerable refugees.

Inter-agency aid convoy reaches rural Homs

On 22 June, a UN/Red Cross/Syrian Arab Red Crescent inter-agency humanitarian convoy delivered food and other items to nearly 110,000 people in the Ar-Rastan area of rural Homs. According to the office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, the last inter-agency convoy to the area was on 30 March. The UN continues to call for safe, unimpeded and sustained access to all people in need across the country, particularly the more than 4.5 million men, women and children in hard-to-reach and besieged areas.
